

Pioneer Quilters Guild Opportunity Quilt 2011

1. Summary:

Produce a beautiful opportunity quilt to raise as much money for the guild as possible, after getting the design approved by the board.

2. Time commitment:

How the time is spread out is entirely up to the committee. Two years is the time frame allowed. This is at the choice of the committee. In the past, the opportunity quilt has been produced by one person, a small group of quilters, or blocks passed out to the general membership for completion.

3. Forms, resources and/or software needed:

The opportunity quilt for 2011 was designed with the help of the quilt software program "Quilt Pro". Many of the long arm quilters used for past quilts can be found in the local guilds. PQG reimbursement forms were also used.

4. Finances:

This is up to the committee chair. Reimbursement for fabric and quilting supplies can be as needed. If guild participation is involved, the chair will have to organize that in a timely fashion. For 2010 and 2011 budget has been \$700, this includes quilting.

5. Transition:

There is no formal transition. The new committee is welcome to set their own schedule.

6. Other notes:

Traditionally the PQG opportunity quilt has been queen sized, but there have been many exceptions. As long as the board approves the design, there are no rules for the quilt. It needs to be finished before the start of the calendar year. Having the quilt finished two or more months ahead of schedule will allow the Ways and Means Committee to have tickets printed with the quilt name, have photos available in the members' ticket packages, and allow them to start marketing the quilt as soon as possible in the new year.
